

## Roatan Packing List

- Work clothes for the construction site (shorts are fine)
- Shoes for the construction site (cover toes)
- Work gloves (recommended)
- Tool belt (optional)
- Hat &/or sunglasses
- Rain poncho (optional)
- Sunscreen & Chapstick
- Wet wipes (optional – handy for the worksite)
- **Refillable water bottle & electrolytes** (we will have water on site)
- Casual clothes for off the site
- Flip flops or sandals
- Swimsuit
- Beach towel (optional)
- Snorkel gear (optional)
- Insect repellent / anti-itch cream
- Personal toiletries
- Personal medications (prescriptions, Tylenol, Benadryl, probiotics, Pepto Bismol, Imodium AD, Band-Aids, etc.)
- Snacks - jerky, protein bars, nuts, trail mix (optional)

### Other things to keep in mind:

- Your passport needs to be good for 6 months beyond the dates of your travel
- It is helpful to review some basic Spanish
- Electrical outlets use the same plugs as US
- Keep jewelry minimal
- It is wise to keep a set of clothes in your carry-on when traveling down, as well as any essential medications
- You might want to set up an international travel plan for your phone to avoid excessive charges, or leave on “airplane mode” while in Roatan
- US \*cash is accepted in most places, credit cards are accepted in bigger stores  
\*cash needs to be in excellent condition – crisp bills, no tears or marks  
It is helpful to have smaller bills for leaving tips.

### \*Optional items for the team to bring:

- Coloring books & colored pencils for the kids in the family / community
- Small matchbox cars, small dolls, bubbles, jump ropes, soccer balls
- Spanish Bible for the family

### \*Optional - Useful items to bring and leave in Roatan:

- Framing & finishing hammers (metal or fiberglass handles)
- Tape measures (26 ft & 33 ft), & metal squares
- Sawzall blades (10 in & 12 in, Diablo general purpose wood/metal)
- Chalk lines, carpenter pencils, sharpies, & utility knives
